It's an easy, scenic walk and a great way to get outside with your dog, enjoy fresh air, and start the year moving together.



WHEN YOU'RE NERVOUS, YOUR DOG KNOWS

How handler stress travels down the leash

Dogs read us with incredible accuracy. Before we ever give a cue, they notice our breathing, posture, and even how tightly we're holding the leash. When we're tense or distracted, that stress often shows up in our dogs as hesitation, sensitivity, or a lack of confidence. It isn't disobedience—it's communication.

The upside?

Calm moves just as quickly. Slower breathing, softer hands, and intentional movement can shift the feel of a session almost instantly.

Winter's slower pace makes this a good moment to check in and reset—on both ends of the leash.



Clear, calm handling gives dogs the best chance to shine. Sometimes the simplest fix isn't about training more—it's about breathing first, no matter the situation or the sport.

TRY THIS: A 60-SECOND RESET

- Take three slow breaths before you start—long exhales matter.
- Drop your shoulders and loosen your grip on the leash.
- Begin with one easy win your dog knows well.
- If things feel off, pause. Stillness can be a powerful reset.


Note from the Editor:
